WICHITA'S MISSOURI PACIFIC DEPOT

The old Missouri Pacific depot at 302 W. Douglas opened January 2, 1901 when train #5 arrived from Kansas City at 7:25 AM. This was in a brick structure 70' X 140' and two stories tall. The ground level was for passenger operations while the top level housed Wichita Division Superintendent offices consisting of agents, clerks, telegraph and dispatching staff.

The flagship Missouri Pacific train to serve Wichita was Geneseo-Wichita 411/412 which was a stub section of St. Louis-Denver 11/12, the Colorado Eagle. This service started during 1942. The Wichita section carried a Denver Pullman until it was taken off February 28, 1961. A year later the train numbers were changed to 34/35.

In May 1964 the depot closed and what little passenger business remained moved north one block to the freight depot at 220 W 1st. Ticket office hours were open for

only one hour nightly from 9:00-10:00 PM. In 1965 the old depot was then torn down.

The final run of 34/35 took place January 4, 1965 when the last train departed from town at 10:20 PM. with a crew of five and about 20 passengers. Of this rider total, 13 had roundtrip tickets to Geneseo and three Denver's. The remainder were riding to Hutchinson and Geneseo. This ended Missouri Pa-

cific passenger service to Wichita that began in 1883.

Trains 11/12 themselves across northern Kansas were abolished April 1966 which ended the final Missouri Pacific varnish in the Sunflower state.

RAILROADING IN WICHITA MARCH 1908

Street railway officials have indicated their willingness to pay 5 percent per year of the cost of a new permanent street railway bridge at Douglas Avenue to the city or county for placing of their tracks on the new concrete bridge, i.e., an annual rental of \$500 (the estimated cost of new bridge being \$10,000). But it seems unlikely the county commission will accept this proposal.

At a conference held Saturday it was verbally agreed that the street car company, the city, and the county would each pay one-third of the cost of moving the street car bridge, provided the county can legally do so.

Letter to editor from College Hill resident urging the street car company to put destination signs on the sides of all the cars. Says the company put on a few side signs but didn't finish the job, and for many cars it is still necessary to walk to the end of the car to see the sign.

Report of further rumors of a Wichita-Hutchinson interurban line. Article also says the new general manager of the Wichita Railroad and Light Company ordered the changing of the Fairmount line from Rutan to Hillside during his recent visit and establishment of a continual half hour service through from the college to the city. Superintendent .Morrison says the extension of the West Side line to Mt. Carmel will also come, but probably not until completion of the new Douglas Avenue bridge.

A through service to Fairmount was put into effect yesterday by the Wichita Street Railway Company. Through cars will leave Main and Douglas at 15 and 45 minutes after the hour.

Report of death yesterday in New York of Russell Harding, former resident of Wichita, and vice-president and general manager of the Missouri Pacific Railway, at age 55, of complications of liver and stomach troubles. In 1885 he was superintendent of the Ft. Scott, Wichita, and Western Railway with headquarters in Wichita. He left Wichita in 1895 and was succeeded by A. H. Webb as division superintendent of the Wichita division.

J. G. Ross, E. H. Hendershot, and W. J. Achelbohl are visiting Wichita today representing the financial interests of the street railway company of which the Wichita Railroad and Light Company is a part. They are inspecting the lines here, and this is their first visit to Wichita.

Report of quarrel in city council between those wanting Waco street car line built first and those wanting the Hillside line to Fairmount built first. No action.

Article reports on recommendations Superintendent Morrison will proposed in his yearly budget to be submitted soon to the eastern directors of the Wichita Street Railway Company. He will recommend spending \$100,000 for improvements. About \$50,000 will be for the laying of double track and paving on North Topeka if the city decides to pave that street. Better service on the baseball park line is also planned. Manager Chubbuck during his recent visit here said he should try to secure some trailer cars from the factory before the season opened. More copper for circuit feeders on this line and it is expected that this will be supplied. Another improvement contemplated is a 90 foot switch between 17th and 18th streets on the Stock Yards line, which will permit the use of one more car on this line to relieve the strain during the congested times. Work on the new Fairmount route will begin as soon as the city grades the street.

City council yesterday deferred action on giving street railway company to build its line on Hillside Avenue by amendment to the company's franchise.

Plans for a bridge over the drainage canal on East Douglas Avenue were adopted. They were drawn by the street railway company's engineers and presented by the city engineer and call for a concrete bridge, to cost approximately \$10,000.

Article about the Stock Yards Trackage association of the four railroads, Missouri Pacific, Santa Fe, Rock Island and Frisco, which handles the switching at the stock yards. They join in maintaining a switch engine and crew. About \$8000 will be spent on improvements to the track and facilities this year.

Enough names have been secured on the Orient bond petition to assure that they will be re-submitted to the voters.

The fender of street car No. 136 apparently saved a young woman who crossed the corner of 1st and Main this morning and was struck by the car. She was uninjured.

Wichita's "Jonah" street car, Number 142, has passed out of existence, the result of a fire which nearly destroyed the car yesterday morning. The street railway company will consign it to the scrap pile. The fire occurred near the loop in Riverside Park when the trolley wire broke, the end of the live wire wrapping around the front of the car and setting it ablaze. Number 142 is known by every street car man in Wichita as the unlucky car. One shooting affray, two or three accidents, and numerous wrecks have been attributed to this car.
